

WHAT IS TRAFFICKING?

Bringing you from your home country, taking advantage of your need for a better life for you and your family, with deceit and false promises of work or easy money, or promising a false relationship as a couple, and forcing you into prostitution and to give them money.

YOU MAY BE A VICTIM OF TRAFFICKING IF

- You have been deceived: you were promised work that you're not doing.
- You're forced to work in poor working conditions of abuse or exploitation.
- They threaten to harm you or your family if you don't do what they say.
- If you're not allowed to carry money or your documents (ID document, passport, etc.) with you.
- If you have to work until your debt is paid.
- If you are not free to go where you like or to change jobs if you want to.

Victims of trafficking have the **RIGHT** to receive information on how to escape from the trafficking situation in their **own language and even if they have no papers.**

In Navarra there is a network of organisations and specialised services that are **FREE OF CHARGE.** Here you can get advice and guidance on:

- Administrative situation: passport, residence and work permits, family grouping, etc.
- Medical card and healthcare.
- Getting out of prostitution (accommodation, food, training, job).
- Psychological support.
- Police protection.
- Legal advice, if you decide to report the matter.

IF YOU ASK FOR HELP

- You won't be criticised for engaging in prostitution or for having been deceived.
- You'll have some time to decide whether or not you wish to report the traffickers.
